Webb Diamond Project Update

Chalice Gold Mines Limited (ASX: CHN; TSX: CXN) advises that Meteoric Resources Limited (ASX: MEI) has recently announced exploration results at the Webb Diamond Project in Western Australia.

GeoCrystal Limited has a 70% interest in the Webb Diamond Project. Chalice has also been granted a conditional first right of refusal on future financings until its stake has reached 51% of GeoCrystal.
