General

Smart Parking Ltd (ASX: SPZ) (Company) comprises two main divisions:

- Managed Services: Headquartered in the UK, this division specialises in managing car parks on behalf of retail customers, land owners and managing agents;
- <u>Technology</u>: Designs, develops and specialises in on-street and off-street leading edge parking technology and software that enables clients to manage parking efficiently and cost effectively.

Appendix 4C - September 2016

Attached is the Company's Appendix 4C for the quarter ending September 30, 2016.

The Company notes the following:

- Receipts and operating cash flows reduced from the prior quarter following the loss of the Asda contract in April 2016 and the completion of technology projects in Q4 FY2016.
- Costs were incurred in the current quarter for technology installations, with the associated receipts of \$0.35m due to be collected in Q2 FY2017.
- The Management Services Division incurred \$0.23m of capital expenditure during the quarter.
- Management anticipate that operating cash flow in the UK Management Services division will continue to improve as a result of the ongoing deployment of technology solutions across new sites and from higher operating margins.
- The Group's unaudited EBITDA for Q1 FY2017 is up 29% versus Q1 FY2016.
- The Company's cash on hand (excluding client funds) decreased \$0.9m to \$2.5m during the quarter.

The company will provide a trading update at the November AGM.
