



ELIZABETH QUAY PEDESTRIAN BRIDGE – PROGRESS UPDATE

- Both arches of Pedestrian and Cyclist Bridge now in place at major Elizabeth Quay development, which will reconnect the city of Perth with the Swan River
- All work conducted with exemplary health and safety record
- Double arch, cable stay suspension bridge is first of its kind in Perth

Second iconic bridge arch now in place

Following the successful lift of the bridge's first arch on 28 May, SRG is pleased to confirm that on 30 June, the second 100 tonne arch in the unique bridge was lifted into place.

The Elizabeth Quay Pedestrian and Cyclist Bridge is an iconic architectural feature which is designed to connect Williams Landing to the newly constructed island at the Elizabeth Quay development in Perth, Western Australia. The iconic double arch, single cable suspension bridge is the first of its kind in Perth.

Under the JV, SRG has contributed expertise with stress bars, cable stays and detailed civil infrastructure.

Next steps

The next steps in the project will see the deck and architectural finishes installed, before the Metropolitan Redevelopment Authority declares the bridge open to the public at the end of the year.

Elizabeth Quay Pedestrian Bridge is the part of the \$2.6 billion Elizabeth Quay project designed to reconnect the Perth city with the Swan River.

The \$ million bridge contract is a Joint Venture between, <u>SRG Limited</u>, <u>Decmil</u> and <u>Hawkins Civil</u> (DASSH) and will connect Williams landing to the new Island at Elizabeth Quay.
