Notice is hereby given that the Annual General Meeting of Shareholders of **Tanami Gold NL ABN 51 000** 617 176 (Tanami or Company) will be held at the Quest South Perth Foreshore, 22 Harper Terrace, South Perth Western Australia on Friday, 24 November 2023 at 10:00am (WST) (the Meeting).

The Explanatory Memorandum to this Notice provides additional information on matters to be considered at the Meeting. The Explanatory Memorandum and the Proxy Form form part of this Notice.

Terms and abbreviations used in this Notice and the Explanatory Memorandum are defined in Section 6.

VOTING ELIGIBILITY

The Directors have determined pursuant to regulation 7.11.37 of the *Corporations Regulations 2001 (Cth)* that the persons eligible to vote at the Meeting are those who are registered as Shareholders on **Wednesday**, **22 November 2023** (being 2 days prior to the date of the meeting) at 10:00am (WST).

VOTING IN PERSON

To vote in person, attend the Meeting on the date and at the place set out above. The Meeting will commence at 10:00am WST.

CORPORATE SHAREHOLDERS

Corporate Shareholders should comply with the execution requirements set out on the proxy form or otherwise with the provisions of section 127 of the Corporations Act. Section 127 of the Corporations Act provides that a company may execute a document without using its common seal if the document is signed by:

- two directors of the company;
- a director and a company secretary of the company; or
- for a proprietary company that has a sole director who is also the company secretary, that director.

CORPORATE REPRESENTATIVES

A corporation may elect to appoint an individual to act as its representative in accordance with section 250D of the Corporations Act, in which case the Company will require a certificate of appointment of the corporate representative executed in accordance with the Corporations Act. The certificate of appointment must be lodged with the Company and/or the Company's share registry before the Meeting or at the registration desk on the day of the Meeting.

VOTING BY PROXY OTHER THAN ONLINE

A shareholder entitled to attend and vote at the meeting is entitled to appoint a proxy. A proxy need not be a shareholder of the company.

The Company encourages Shareholders to appoint the Chair as your proxy. To do so, mark the appropriate box on the Proxy Form. If the person you wish to appoint as your proxy is someone other than the Chair, please write the name of that person in the space provided on the Proxy Form. To appoint a second proxy you must, on each Proxy Form, state (in the appropriate box) the percentage of your voting rights which are the subject of the relevant proxy. If both Proxy Forms do not specify that percentage, each proxy may exercise half your votes. Fractions of votes will be disregarded.

You may direct your proxy how to vote by placing a mark in the 'FOR', 'AGAINST' or 'ABSTAIN' box opposite the Resolution. All your votes will be cast in accordance with such a direction unless you indicate only a portion of voting rights are to be voted on the Resolution by inserting the percentage or number of Shares you wish to vote in the appropriate boxes. If you do not mark any of the boxes next to a Resolution, your proxy may vote as he or she chooses. If you mark more than one box on the Resolution, your vote will be invalid.

If you complete and return a proxy form, you may still attend the meeting in person, revoke the proxy and vote at the meeting.

- (b) a Closely Related Party of such a member.

However, a person (the "voter") may cast a vote on this Resolution as a proxy if the vote is not cast on behalf of such a member or a Closely Related Party of such a member and either:

- (c) the voter is appointed as a proxy by writing that specifies the way the proxy is to vote on the Resolution; or
- (d) the voter is the chair of the meeting and the appointment of the chair as proxy does not specify the way the proxy is to vote on the Resolution and expressly authorises the chair to exercise the proxy even if the Resolution is connected directly or indirectly with the remuneration of a member of a Group Company's key management personnel.

Resolution 2 – Election of Mr Brett Montgomery

To consider and, if thought fit, pass with or without amendment, the following resolution as an Ordinary Resolution:

"That in accordance with Article 13.2 of the Company's Constitution, Listing Rules 14.4 and 14.5, and for all other purposes, Mr Brett Montgomery, a Director who was appointed on 6 February 2013, retires and, being eligible, is elected as a Director on the terms and conditions in the Explanatory Memorandum.

Resolution 3 – Election of Mr Neale Edwards

To consider and, if thought fit, pass with or without amendment, the following resolution as an Ordinary Resolution:

"That in accordance with Article 13.2 of the Company's Constitution, Listing Rules 14.4 and 14.5, and for all other purposes, Mr Neale Edwards, a Director who was appointed on 28 May 2021, retires and, being eligible, is elected as a Director on the terms and conditions in the Explanatory Memorandum.

1. Introduction

This Explanatory Memorandum is provided to Shareholders of **Tanami Gold NL ACN 000 617 176** to explain the Resolutions to be put to Shareholders at the Annual General Meeting to be held at Quest South Perth Foreshore on **24 Friday, November 2023 at 10:00am (WST)**.

The Directors recommend Shareholders read the accompanying Notice of Annual General Meeting and Explanatory Memorandum in full before making any decision in relation to the Resolutions.

2. Consider the Company's 2023 Annual Report

In accordance with the Corporations Act, the first item of the Notice deals with the consolidated annual financial statements of the Company for the financial year ended 30 June 2023, together with the Directors' declaration and report in relation to that financial year and the auditor's report on those annual financial statements.

Shareholders should consider these documents and raise any matters of interest with the Directors when this item is being considered.

No Resolution is required to be moved in respect of this item.

Shareholders will be given a reasonable opportunity at the Annual General Meeting to ask questions and make comments on the accounts and on the business, operations and management of the Company.

The Chair will also provide Shareholders a reasonable opportunity to ask the auditor questions relevant to:

- the conduct of the audit;
- the preparation and content of the independent audit report;
- the accounting policies adopted by the Company in relation to the preparation of accounts; and
- the independence of the auditor in relation to the conduct of the audit.

Written questions to the Company's auditor relevant to the content of the auditor's report or the conduct of the audit may be submitted to the Company may be submitted no later than 5 business days before the Meeting to the Company Secretary at the Company's registered office.

3. Resolution 1 – Approval of the Remuneration Report

3.1 FY2023 Remuneration Report

The Annual Report for the year ended 30 June 2023 contains a Remuneration Report that sets out the details of the remuneration of all Directors and Key Management Personnel during the financial year. In addition, it describes the Board's remuneration policy. In accordance with section 250R(2) of the Corporations Act the Company is required to present to its Shareholders the Remuneration Report as disclosed in the Company's 2023 Annual Report.

The Chair of the Meeting will allow a reasonable opportunity for Shareholders to ask questions about, or make comments on, the Remuneration Report at the Meeting. In addition, Shareholders will be asked to vote on the Remuneration Report.

The Board submits the Remuneration Report to Shareholders for their consideration and adoption by way of a non-binding Resolution as required by the Corporations Act.

The Resolution is advisory only and does not bind the Company or its Directors. The Board will consider the outcome of the vote and comments made by Shareholders on the Remuneration Report when reviewing the Company's remuneration policies.

Any undirected proxies held by the Chair will be voted in favour of Resolution 1.

The Company encourages all Shareholders to cast their vote in relation to Resolution 1.

3.2 Corporations Act Requirements

A company is required to put to its Shareholders a resolution proposing the calling of another meeting of Shareholders to consider the appointment of Directors of the Company (**Spill Resolution**) if, at consecutive Annual General Meetings, at least 25% of the votes cast on a Remuneration Report resolution are voted against adoption of the Remuneration Report and at the first of those Annual General Meetings a Spill Resolution was not put to vote. If required, the Spill Resolution must be put to vote at the second of those Annual General Meetings.

If more than 50% of shareholders vote in favour of the Spill Resolution, the Company must convene the Extraordinary General Meeting (**Spill Meeting**) within 90 days of the second Annual General Meeting.

All of the Directors who were in office when the Company's Directors' Report (as included in the Company's Annual Financial Report for the financial year immediately before the second Annual General Meeting) was approved, other than any Managing Director of the Company, will cease to hold office immediately before the end of the Spill Meeting but may stand for re-election at the Spill Meeting.

Following the Spill Meeting those persons whose election or re-election as Director is approved will be the Directors of the Company.

The FY2023 Remuneration Report sets out the Company's remuneration arrangements for Directors and Key Management Personnel. The Remuneration Report is part of the Directors' Report contained in the FY2023 Annual Financial Report.

A reasonable opportunity will be provided for discussion of the Remuneration Report at the Annual General Meeting.

Voting Exclusion

Note that a voting exclusion applies to Resolution 1 in the terms set out in the Notice.

4. **Resolution 2 – Election of Brett Montgomery**

Resolution 2 seeks the re-election of Mr Brett Montgomery as a Non-Executive Director of the Company. Mr Montgomery was appointed as a Non-Executive Director of the Company on 6 February 2013.

Mr Montgomery retires by rotation in accordance with Clause 13.2 of the Constitution and, being eligible, offers himself for re-election.

Mr Montgomery has served on the board of mining and exploration companies and has extensive experience in the management of publicly listed companies. Mr Montgomery is a Non-Executive Director of AIC Mines Limited (ASX : A1M) and Non-Executive Chairman of ASX listed Golden Rim Resources Limited (ASX : GMR).

Being eligible, Mr Montgomery offers himself for re-election as a Non-Executive Director.

Mr Montgomery is a Member of the Audit Committee and Chairman of the Remuneration and Nomination Committee.

Directors' Recommendation

The Board (other than Mr Montgomery) recommends shareholders vote in favour of the Resolution.

Any undirected directed proxies held by the Chair will be voted in favour of Resolution 2

5. Resolution 3 – Re-Election of Mr Neale Edwards as a Director

Resolution 3 seeks the re-election of Mr Neale Edwards as a Non-Executive Director of the Company. Mr Edwards was appointed as a Non-Executive Director of the Company on 28 May 2021.

Mr Edwards retires by rotation in accordance with Clause 13.2 of the Constitution and, being eligible, offers himself for re-election.

Mr Edwards holds a Bachelor of Applied Science in Applied Geology and a Bachelor of Science with Honours, and is a Fellow of the Australian Institute of Geoscientists. Mr Edwards 'experience covers projects ranging from grassroots level through to mine development and mining in major geological provinces in Australia, the Pacific Rim, northern Africa and northern Europe. Mr Edwards was responsible for the discovery of significant gold resources in the Southern Cross Province of Western Australia for Samantha Gold and the identification of project opportunities that resulted in Hong Kong listed Dragon Mining Limited (HKEx : 1712) becoming an established gold producer in the Nordic Region. Mr Edwards a Non-Executive Director of ASX listed Prodigy Gold NL (ASX : PRX).

Mr Edwards is a Member of the Audit Committee and the Remuneration and Nomination Committee.

Being eligible, Mr Edwards offers himself for re-election as a Non-Executive Director.

Directors' Recommendation

The Board (other than Mr Edwards) recommends shareholders vote in favour of the Resolution. Any undirected proxies held by the Chair will be voted in favour of Resolution 3.
