PHASE 3 DRILLING STARTS AT GARDEN GULLY

Thundelarra is pleased to report that a Reverse Circulation rig with capacity to drill holes to in excess of 400m depth is now at Garden Gully and Phase 3 drilling is underway. A total of approximately 2,400m is planned in about eight holes of 300-350m, with ~600m of diamond tails to follow as warranted.




Figure 1. Garden Gully Prospects hosting follow-up drill targets.

Lydia, Battery, Transylvania and Granite Well will be drilled in this programme. A main objective is to establish the orientation of the structural controls for the gold mineralisation discovered to date.

The other prospects at Garden Gully still require follow-up testing, which provisionally is planned for the next drilling programme.




Figure 2. Garden Gully location showing proximity to local plant and infrastructure.

The Garden Gully project, wholly-owned by Thundelarra, comprises 14 granted Prospecting Licences, 1 granted Exploration Licence, and one Exploration Licence application covering about 65.5 square kilometres and is located in Western Australia's Doolgunna region (Figure 2) about 20km north-west of the town of Meekatharra.
