To receive and consider the annual financial report of the Company for the financial year ended 31 December 2018 together with the declaration of the directors, the director's report, the Remuneration Report and the auditor's report.

# 1. RESOLUTION 1 – ADOPTION OF REMUNERATION REPORT

To consider and, if thought fit, to pass, with or without amendment, the following resolution as a **non-binding resolution**:

"That, for the purposes of section 250R(2) of the Corporations Act and for all other purposes, approval is given for the adoption of the Remuneration Report as contained in the Company's annual financial report for the financial year ended 31 December 2018."

Note: the vote on this Resolution is advisory only and does not bind the Directors or the Company.

#### **Voting Prohibition Statement:**

A vote on this Resolution must not be cast (in any capacity) by or on behalf of either of the following persons:

- (a) a member of the Key Management Personnel, details of whose remuneration are included in the Remuneration Report; or
- (b) a Closely Related Party of such a member.

However, a person (the voter) described above may cast a vote on this Resolution as a proxy if the vote is not cast on behalf of a person described above and either:

- (a) the voter is appointed as a proxy by writing that specifies the way the proxy is to vote on this Resolution; or
- (b) the voter is the Chair and the appointment of the Chair as proxy:
  - (i) does not specify the way the proxy is to vote on this Resolution; and
  - (ii) expressly authorises the Chair to exercise the proxy even though this Resolution is connected directly or indirectly with the remuneration of a member of the Key Management Personnel.

# 2. RESOLUTION 2 – ELECTION OF DIRECTOR – MR EVAN CRANSTON

To consider and, if thought fit, to pass, with or without amendment, the following resolution as an **ordinary resolution**:

"That, for the purpose of Article 10.3(j) of the Constitution and for all other purposes, Mr Evan Cranston, a Director, retires, and being eligible, is elected as a Director."

# 3. RESOLUTION 3 – RE-ELECTION OF DIRECTOR – MR TOLGA KUMOVA

To consider and, if thought fit, to pass, with or without amendment, the following resolution as an **ordinary resolution**:

"That, for the purpose of Article 10.3(c) of the Constitution and for all other purposes, Mr Tolga Kumova, a Director, retires by rotation, and being eligible, is re-elected as a Director."

### 4. RESOLUTION 4 – APPOINTMENT OF AUDITOR AT FIRST AGM

To consider and, if thought fit, to pass the following resolution as an **ordinary resolution**:

"That, for the purposes of section 327B of the Corporations Act and for all other purposes, Grant Thornton Audit Pty Ltd, having been nominated by a Shareholder and having consented in writing to act in the capacity of auditor, be appointed as auditor of the Company with effect from the close of the meeting."

#### How to vote

In accordance with section 249L of the Corporations Act, Shareholders are advised that:

- each Shareholder has a right to appoint a proxy;
- the proxy need not be a Shareholder of the Company; and
- a Shareholder who is entitled to cast two or more votes may appoint two proxies and may specify the proportion or number of votes each proxy is appointed to exercise. If the member appoints two proxies and the appointment does not specify the proportion or number of the member's votes, then in accordance with section 249X(3) of the Corporations Act, each proxy may exercise one half of the votes.

Shareholders and their proxies should be aware that changes to the Corporations Act made in 2011 mean that:

- if proxy holders vote, they must cast all directed proxies as directed; and
- any directed proxies which are not voted will automatically default to the Chair, who must vote the proxies as directed.

# **EXPLANATORY STATEMENT**

This Explanatory Statement has been prepared to provide information which the Directors believe to be material to Shareholders in deciding whether or not to pass the Resolutions.

### **FINANCIAL STATEMENTS AND REPORTS**

In accordance with the Constitution, the business of the Meeting will include receipt and consideration of the annual financial report of the Company for the financial year ended 31 December 2018 together with the declaration of the directors, the directors' report, the Remuneration Report and the auditor's report. Shareholders should consider these documents and raise any matters of interest with the Directors when this item is being considered.

No resolution is required to be moved in respect of this item.

Shareholders will be given a reasonable opportunity at the Annual General Meeting to ask questions and make comments on the accounts and on the management of the Company.

The Chair will also give Shareholders a reasonable opportunity to ask the auditor or the auditor's representative questions relevant to:

- (a) the conduct of the audit;
- (b) the preparation and content of the independent audit report;
- (c) the accounting policies adopted by the Company in relation to the preparation of the financial statements; and
- (d) the independence of the auditor in relation to the conduct of the audit.

The Chair will also allow a reasonable opportunity for the auditor or their representative to answer any written questions submitted to the Auditor under section 250PA of the Corporations Act.

The Company will not provide a hard copy of the Company's annual financial report to Shareholders unless specifically requested to do so. The Company's annual financial report is available on its website at www.african-gold.com.

#### 1. RESOLUTION 1 – ADOPTION OF REMUNERATION REPORT

# 1.1 General

The Corporations Act requires that at a listed company's annual general meeting, a resolution that the remuneration report be adopted must be put to the shareholders. However, such a resolution is advisory only and does not bind the company or the directors of the company.

The remuneration report sets out the company's remuneration arrangements for the directors and senior management of the company. The remuneration report is part of the directors' report contained in the annual financial report of the company for a financial year.

The chair of the meeting must allow a reasonable opportunity for its shareholders to ask questions about or make comments on the remuneration report at the annual general meeting.

# 1.2 Voting consequences

A company is required to put to its shareholders a resolution proposing the calling of another meeting of shareholders to consider the appointment of directors of the company (**Spill Resolution**) if, at consecutive annual general meetings, at least 25% of the votes cast on a remuneration report resolution are voted against adoption of the remuneration report and at the first of those annual general meetings a Spill Resolution was not put to vote. If required, the Spill Resolution must be put to vote at the second of those annual general meetings.

If more than 50% of votes cast are in favour of the Spill Resolution, the company must convene a shareholder meeting (**Spill Meeting**) within 90 days of the second annual general meeting.

All of the directors of the company who were in office when the directors' report (as included in the company's annual financial report for the most recent financial year) was approved, other than the managing director of the company, will cease to hold office immediately before the end of the Spill Meeting but may stand for re-election at the Spill Meeting.

Following the Spill Meeting those persons whose election or re-election as directors of the company is approved will be the directors of the company.

# 1.3 Previous voting results

This is the Company's first annual general meeting since its registration as a public company. Accordingly, if at least 25% of the votes cast on this Resolution are against the adoption of the remuneration report, it will not result in the Company putting a Spill Resolution to Shareholders.

### 2. RESOLUTION 2 – ELECTION OF DIRECTOR – MR EVAN CRANSTON

# 2.1 General

Article 10.2(b) of the Constitution allows the Directors to appoint at any time a person to be a Director, either to fill a casual vacancy or as an addition to the existing Directors, but only where the total number of Directors does not at any time exceed the maximum number specified by the Constitution. Article 10.3(j) of the Constitution provides that a Director so appointed holds office only until the next following annual general meeting and is then eligible for election.

Mr Cranston was appointed as a Director by resolution of the Board on 22 March 2018. Pursuant to Article 10.3(j) of the Constitution, Mr Cranston will retire and seek election.

# 2.2 Qualifications and other material directorships

Evan Cranston is an experienced mining executive with a background in corporate and mining law. He is the principal of corporate advisory and administration firm Konkera Corporate and has extensive experience in the areas of equity capital markets, corporate finance, structuring, asset acquisition, corporate governance and external stakeholder relations. He holds both a Bachelor of Commerce and Bachelor of Laws from the University of Western Australia.

# 2.3 Independence

If elected the board considers Mr Cranston will be an independent director.

#### 2.4 Board recommendation

The Board (with the exception of Mr Cranston) supports the election of Mr Cranston and recommends that Shareholders vote in favour of Resolution 2.

### 3. RESOLUTION 3 – ELECTION OF DIRECTOR – MR TOLGA KUMOVA

#### 3.1 General

Article 10.2(e) of the Constitution requires an election of Directors to take place each year. Article 10.3(c) of the Constitution requires one-third of the directors to retire from office as director. Any Director who retires from office under Article 10.3(c) is eligible for re-election by resolution of the Company.

Mr Kumova was appointed as a Director by resolution of the Board on 1 February 2018. Pursuant to Article 10.3(c) of the Constitution, Mr Kumova will retire and seek re-election.

# 3.2 Qualifications and other material directorships

Tolga Kumova has 15 years' experience in stockbroking, corporate finance and corporate restructuring, and has specialised in initial public offerings and capital requirements of mining focused companies. He has raised in excess of \$500 million for mining ventures, varying from inception stage through to construction and development.

Mr Kumova was a founding shareholder of Syrah Resources in 2010 and served as an Executive Director from May 2013 to October 2016, and as Managing Director from October 2014 to October 2016. During his tenure at Syrah Resources, Mr Kumova led the business from resource stage through to full funding through to development, gaining experience negotiating offtake agreements with numerous globally recognised counterparties.

# 3.3 Independence

If elected the board considers Mr Kumova will not be an independent director due to being a substantial shareholder and was a founder of the Company.

### 3.4 Board recommendation

The Board (with the exception of Mr Kumova) supports the re-election of Mr Kumova and recommends that Shareholders vote in favour of Resolution 3.

### 4. RESOLUTION 4 – APPOINTMENT OF AUDITOR AT FIRST AGM

The Directors of a public company must appoint an auditor within one month of registration. The directors have appointed Grant Thornton Audit Pty Ltd as the Company's auditor.

The auditor of a public company so appointed within one month of registration holds office until the first annual general meeting of the Company. The auditor must be re-appointed at the first annual general meeting so that they may continue to act as auditor of the Company.

In accordance with section 328B(1) of the Corporations Act, the Company has sought and obtained a nomination from a shareholder for Grant Thornton Audit Pty Ltd to be appointed as the Company's auditor. A copy of this nomination is attached to this Explanatory Statement as Schedule 1.

Grant Thornton Audit Pty Ltd has given its written consent to act as the Company's auditor subject to shareholder approval of this resolution.

If this resolution is passed, the appointment of Grant Thornton Audit Pty Ltd as the Company's auditor will take effect at the close of this Meeting.
